## **Free SBH Services!**

Senior Behavioral Health started offering free monthly Depression and Memory Screenings as well as a Grief/Loss Support Group in October of 2011 at the Structured Outpatient Program building at 804 W. St. John in Girard.

The free Depression and Memory Screenings take place the last Wednesday of each month from 1-3 p.m. Directly afterwards is the Grief/Loss Support Group from 3-4 p.m.

Our outpatient therapists administer the assessments and facilitate the support group. An appropriate referral for assessment would include anyone age 55 or older who has been experiencing signs of depression or memory difficulties.

Those who wish to may have a brief results report faxed to their primary care physician so that medical interventions may be considered. Those 55 and older considering attendance to the Grief/Loss Support Group are welcome no matter what issues are at the root of their discomfort.

cost the country \$200
billion this year. If the

trajectory, 16 percent of
Americans age 65 and
older will have

climb to \$1 trillion.
