The May 19th, 2012 Alzheimer's Walk in Pittsburg, KS was a smashing success! The main goal of the event was to raise donation dollars toward assisting Southeast Kansas families in caring for loved ones coping with Alzheimer's disease. Last Year's record donation totaled \$19,000. That achievement was significantly outdone with this year's contributions reaching the \$25,000 mark. What a community effort! Individuals and area businesses donated 70+ items/ gift certificates for the silent auction and raffle.
